Cost to solve



Data

- Initial evaluation (quantity, quality, bias...)
- Does the available data constrain your solution?
- Have you missed potential sources of data?







Solve

- Evaluate multiple approaches
- Understand trade-offs
- Be prepared to stop





Unpredictable production failures causing loss of high value product and serious manufacturing delays

Up to \$1 million losses incurred per failed batch

Very limited data available









Deploy

- Is your solution ready?
- Deploy now and refine in-service?
- Ensure solutions are used and remain viable
